Ages 9 – 13

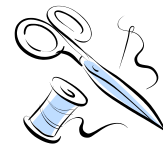
8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

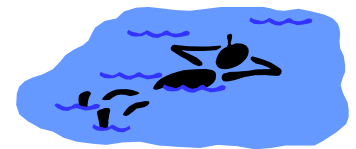
